Contemporary Issues of U.S. Constitutional Law

Professor Adeno Addis (Tulane Law School) and Professor Jörg Fedtke (Passau) Chair of Common Law WS 2017/2018

Disputes involving the reach of executive power, judicial independence, the inner workings of the Senate, federalism, and human rights protection have mired the first months of the Trump Presidency and triggered an intense national and international debate about fundamental aspects of the U.S. Constitution. Adeno Addis, a distinguished constitutional scholar from Tulane Law School in New Orleans/Louisiana, will be co-teaching with Professor Fedtke a short course covering some of these issues during a visit to Passau in November and December 2017. The aim is to discuss key questions of contemporary American constitutionalism and to identify, wherever possible, current trends in the development of the country's constitutional infrastructure.
